SUBJECT: REGULATIONS - NEWSSTANDS AND NEWSPAPER HONOR BOXES

It has been determined to amend the Regulations for Newsstands and Newspaper Honor Boxes effective March 1, 1961, as follows:

A. Delete Regulation No. 5 which presently reads:

5. Each applicant for a license for a newsstand location shall submit with his application a letter of intention from a Philadelphia daily newspaper stating that the publisher intends to supply newspapers to the applicant for sale at that location. Such a letter of intent is a prerequisite to a license pursuant to these regulations and to continued lawful operation of a newsstand.

B. Amend Regulation No. 13 to read:

13. Newsstands shall not be located on traffic islands, on street dividers or in any manner that would interfere with a fire hydrant hose connection. Honor boxes shall not be attached to fire hydrants. Honor boxes located on traffic islands or street dividers shall be removed on order of the Department of Streets, if they are determined to be hazardous to pedestrian or vehicular traffic.

In accordance with Section 8-407 of the Philadelphia Home Rule Charter, you are requested to have these modifications in the regulations properly advertised.
